

## Howletch Lane Primary School Sport Premium 2015 - 2016

## What is Sport Premium?

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to school to be used to enhance and provide sporting opportunities for pupils. The funding amount which schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age that the school has at January of that year. The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increasing participation in PE & Sport.

At Howletch Lane Primary School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

The 2015 - 2016 Sport Premium funding for Howletch Lane Primary School is £9,610

The money is used for:

- 1/. Investing in the Easington School Sport Partnership Service Level Agreement (£5,000) to provide the school with the following:
- Liaise with the school to develop an annual bespoke P.E. & Sport action plan.
- Providing curriculum support and high quality CPD for teachers, teaching assistants, NQT's, team teaching, twilights, professional development days etc.
- Provision of High Quality Coaching support across a variety of sports.
- A full organised annual programme of competitions/tournaments/festivals in addition to the National School Games.
- Participation, inclusion and excellence opportunities.
- Access to the gifted & talented multi-skill academy for Year 5 & 6 children.
- Provision of an after-school activity in every term in a variety of sports.

- SSP Network meetings to support PE Co-ordinators / PLTs in their role developing PE & sport within their school.
- Identifying opportunities for young leaders to practise their skills through volunteering in schools.
- Assistance in the process of applying for Sainsbury's school games awards and the national 'Kitemark' status for High Quality Provision of P.E. & School Sport.
- Promotion and development of links to local sports club.
- Sustain and grow the network of Change4life clubs.
- Central co-ordination of school sport programmes in SSP area.

## <u>In addition to the above, we have also spent our Sport Premium Funding in</u> the following ways:

- 2/. **Swimming** for KS2 throughout the year and an extra booster session is planned for Year 6 during the last term (as carried out last year) to enable children who still need work on 'water confidence' or distance achievements to have the chance to do this before they leave Primary school. Transport to and from the swimming pool. £2,400 + £1,600 = £4,000 total.
- 3/. Working closely with Sunderland football club representatives from the Foundation of Light to provide a weekly session in school working with all age groups from Nursery (EY) up to Year 6. These sessions help to develop basic ball control skills, games skills, co-operation and teamwork.

  Curriculum coaching £1,520.

## 4/. SAFC after school club - £760

- 5/. Subsidised two day trip away for Year 6 pupils after SATs. Pupils have the chance to visit an outdoor adventure centre such as Dukeshouse Wood in Hexham to enjoy two days of activities such as abseiling, climbing, crate stacking and assault course. This helps with team building and confidence building and gives pupils the opportunity to try new and adventurous activities. £1,500 subsidy.
- 6/. One day Bushcraft activities for Year 5 pupils within the school grounds. £1,300.

- 7). Replenishing sports equipment for break times for both KS1 and KS2 yards.
- 8) Buying a New Age Curling kit for use with our SEND pupils and also used for a weekly after school club.
- 9). Payment for transportation to sporting events, increasing opportunities for our SEND pupils to take part in competitive sports such as the Disability Games at Chester le Street to be held in the Summer term 2016.
- 10). Investing in the **FISCH** programme to tackle obesity in young people and build confidence. School invests money in the **Sporting Chance** programme which aims to carry on the good work from the FISCH programme which takes place in school. The Sporting Chance programme which runs at the Leisure Centre and college, targets specific pupils and their families and has had a very positive impact for a number of schools in the Peterlee area.

As illustrated above, the money allocated to the above activities extends well above the Sports Premium amount. However, we believe the impact of spending extra money in this way is very worthwhile and has had huge benefits to the pupils and the school community as a whole.
