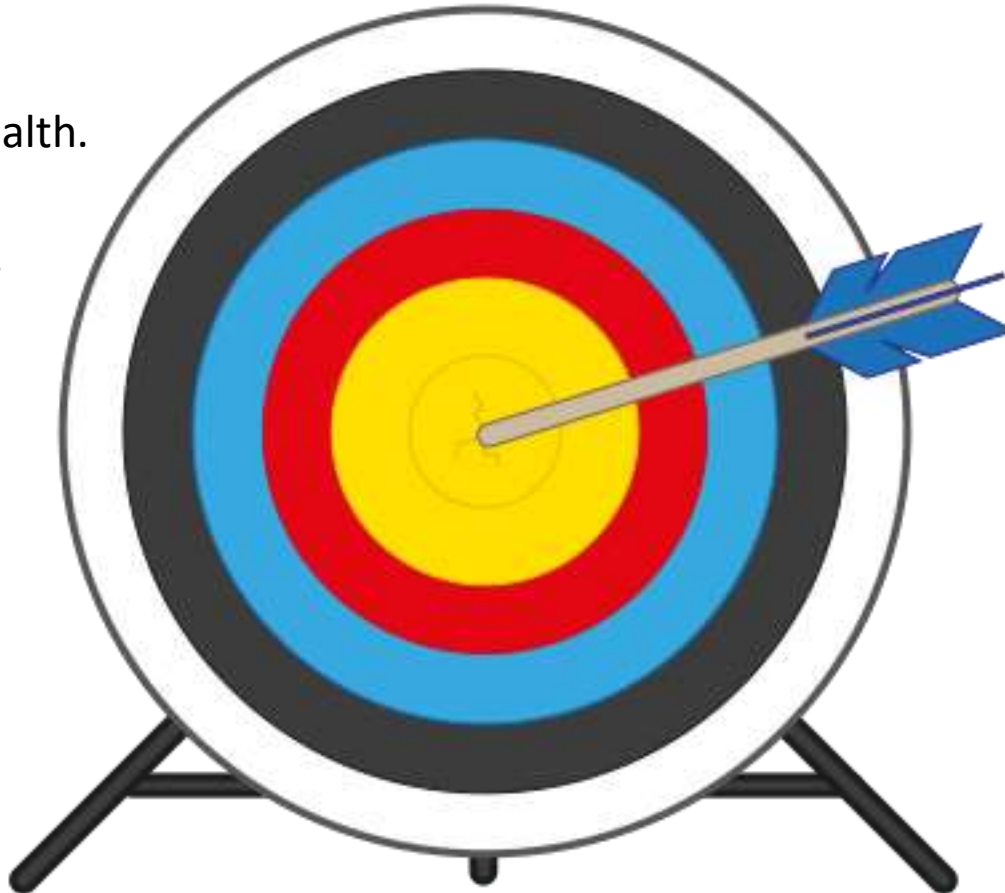

To develop an understanding of how Art reflects and shapes our society, contributing to a nation's culture, creativity and wealth.


To produce , original creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences.
