

MATHS

This half term we will be consolidating our knowledge of counting within 100. We will read and write numerals up to 100. We will build up number bonds and related facts of addition and subtraction.

RE

This half term we will be learning about St Cuthbert. We will be looking at why he was important and what he did. We will discuss why people go to Lindisfarne and why Durham Cathedral is important.

ENGLISH

In English, we are going to read *The Colour Monster* by Anna Llenas and *The day the Crayons Quit* by Drew Daywalt. We will focus on writing using capital letters at the beginning of sentences for names, names of places and days of the week. We will learn to use full stops at the end of sentences. We will be looking at how stories are built up using a beginning, middle and end. We will read sentences back to make sure they make sense and discuss what we have written with adults and the other children in class.

PE

We will discuss the importance of warm ups and how to move in a game. We will be developing throwing and catching skills. How to work as a group and move with agility. We will play games and take part in Commando Joe's.
