

MATHS

This half term we will be consolidating our knowledge of counting, reading and writing numbers within 100. We will build up number bonds and related facts of addition and subtraction. We will begin to count in 2's and learn our 2 times tables.

RE

This half term we will be learning about St Cuthbert. We will be looking at why he was important and what he did. We will discuss why people go to Lindisfarne and why Durham Cathedral is important.

ENGLISH

In English, we are going to read *The Colour Monster* by Anna Llenas and *The day the Crayons Quit* by Drew Daywalt. During this term, we will explore the texts and write our own simple sentences using capital letters and full stops, question marks and explanation marks. We will have a real focus on children being able to read back their own writing and each other's. By the end of the half term, we will have created our own 3 part (beginning, middle and end) short story.

PE

We will discuss the importance of warm ups and how to move in a game. We will be developing throwing and catching skills through games like piggy in the middle. How to work as a group and move with agility. In Commando Joe's, we will build our team spirit and communication skills.
