**Sport Premium**  
**2017-2018**

***What is Sport Premium?***

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to school to be used to enhance and provide sporting opportunities for pupils. This year, the government have announced that they are doubling the amount of money that they are giving to schools for this purpose. The funding amount which schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age that the school has on roll. The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increasing participation in PE & Sport.

At Howletch Lane Primary School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

The 2017 - 2018 Sport Premium funding for Howletch Lane Primary School is £16,000 lump sum plus £10 per pupils in Yr 1 - Yr 6. This gives us a total amount of **£19,190**

The money is used for:

1/. Investing in the **Easington School Sport Partnership Service Level Agreement** (£5,000) to provide the school with the following:

- Liaise with the school to develop an annual bespoke P.E. & Sport action plan.
- Providing curriculum support and high quality CPD for teachers, teaching assistants, NQT's, team teaching, twilights, professional development days etc.
- Provision of High Quality Coaching support across a variety of sports.
- A full organised annual programme of competitions/tournaments/festivals **in addition** to the National School Games.
- Participation, inclusion and excellence opportunities.

- Access to the gifted & talented multi-skill academy for Year 5 & 6 children.
- Provision of an after-school activity in every term in a variety of sports eg Curling, Basketball.
- SSP Network meetings to support PE Co-ordinators / PLTs in their role developing PE & sport within their school.
- Identifying opportunities for young leaders to practise their skills through volunteering in schools.
- Assistance in the process of applying for Sainsbury's school games awards and the national 'Kitemark' status for High Quality Provision of P.E. & School Sport.
- Promotion and development of links to local sports club.
- Sustain and grow the network of Change4life clubs.
- Central co-ordination of school sport programmes in SSP area.

**In addition to the above, we have also spent our Sport Premium Funding in the following ways:**

2/. Working closely with **Sunderland football club representatives** from the Foundation of Light to provide a weekly session in school working with all age groups from Nursery (EY) up to Year 6. These sessions help to develop basic ball control skills, games skills, co-operation and teamwork.

Curriculum coaching - £3330

3/. **SAFC after school club** - £825

4/. Premier League Primary Stars - Howletch is now registered to benefit from coaching and extensive resources from this organisation in PE / PSHE and also other subject areas. Sunderland football coaches will help to deliver this programme whilst upskilling teaching staff.

5/. **Subsidised two day trip away for Year 6** pupils after SATs. Pupils have the chance to visit an outdoor adventure centre such as Dukeshouse Wood in Hexham to enjoy two days of activities such as abseiling, climbing, zip wire and assault course. This helps with team building and confidence building and gives

pupils the opportunity to try new and adventurous activities. £2699 subsidy last year.

6/. **One day Bushcraft** activities for all Year 5 pupils within the school grounds. Approximately £350.

7/. **Swimming** - the school takes an SLA for swimming to enable one class from Yrs 4 - 6 to attend weekly swimming lessons. In addition to this, the school also pays for extra lessons at the end of the Summer term in order for those pupils who have not yet passed their 25 metres to attend tuition to allow them to meet the required standard. £2,695 + £1,700 transport costs + £490 extra sessions

8/. **Transport** to and from competitive events such as the Disability Games at Chester le Street. £1,000.

9/. CPD - attendance at courses to upskill staff in the delivery of PE £700

10/. Sporting Chance - Investing in the **FISCH** programme to tackle obesity in young people and build confidence. School invests money in the **Sporting Chance** programme which aims to carry on the good work from the FISCH programme which takes place in school. The Sporting Chance programme which runs at the Leisure Centre and college, targets specific pupils and their families and has had a very positive impact for a number of schools in the Peterlee area. £500

The above activities come to a total of £19,289 which is £99 over the amount of income for the year. However the costings are subject to change and in the past few years, spending on sport provision has also exceeded the incoming budget.

We feel that the benefits of this provision are worth any additional cost and we feel confident that we can fund the above activities with a small contribution from school fund to subsidise any difference between outgoings and income.
